- Section 4: A monologue (e.g., a lecture) on an academic subject. Teachers ought to give different strategies for succeeding in the test, such as:
- 1. Predictive Listening: Teachers should make students examine the questions and predict the types of information they will need to listen for. Teachers have to involve students in identifying key words in the questions, guessing grammatical forms (e.g., names, dates, numbers), and anticipating the overall context.
- 2. Recognizing Speaker Attitudes and Intentions: IELTS Listening frequently demands understanding not just the literal words spoken but also the speaker's ideas, attitudes, opinions, and intentions. This involves making students concentrated in changes in tone, stress patterns, and the use of modality.
