

TEACHING CONJUNCTIONS EFFECTIVELY

Abstract:

Mastering all aspects of grammar is important while learning any language. Conjunctions are words which connect parts of each sentence by making writing and speaking easier and more comprehensive. Introduction:

First and foremost, it is important to give details about types of conjunctions. There are three types of conjunctions. These are coordinating, subordinating and correlative

conjunctions. Teachers are supposed to interpret each conjunction via presentation. For example, Coordinating Conjunctions: These are conjunctions that connect words, phrases, or clauses. Teachers are able to make students remember the “FANBOYS” which is acronym of : For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So. It will be easier for students to remember all types coordinating conjunctions by memorizing the word **FANBOYS**.

The second type of conjunction is “Subordinating Conjunctions”. These conjunctions connect a dependent clause (a type clause which cannot stand alone as a sentence) to an independent clause. This conjunction includes because, since, although, if, unless, while, after, before. Teachers are supposed to give examples for each type of conjunction. The third type of conjunction is “Correlative Conjunctions”: These conjunctions work in pairs to connect words or phrases. For example, both...and, either...or, neither...nor, not only...but also.

Conclusion:

In conclusion, learning conjunctions is crucial for strong language skills, these three types of conjunctions can be challenging for some students. By providing clear explanations, memorable mnemonics like FANBOYS, and life long sentences, the conjunctions can be mastered easily.
